Despite impressive gains for women in Congress in the 2018 elections, the United States ranks only 75th out of 193 countries for women representation in government. The picture in corporate America is even worse. According to Jan 31, 2020 figures, women hold only 5.8% of CEO positions at S&P 500 companies.

26.5%. By any measure, when women make up 47% of the labor force they are still grossly underrepresented in positions of power in this country.



Let's be clear. We desperately need the inclusive, sensible and collaborative qualities so many women bring to the table. Look at any well-run business and you'll witness the talents and intelligence of women throughout the organization. Women now earn more than half of doctoral degrees awarded in the US, dominating in public administration, health sciences, and social and behavioral

sciences. And while still underrepresented in math, computer science and engineering, those numbers are growing, as girls face down damaging stereotypes and tech employers are forced to recognize that not hiring women hurts their bottom lines.

We've all seen the belligerent, hostile management style of so many male-run companies. We certainly see it in politics. And yes, of course there are ruthless women too. But I'm convinced a more cooperative, female dynamic will have a



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constructive effect throughout our economy and political culture. Women are strong and powerful. I've known such women in my own family and life. That strength combined with a willingness to work together and listen to all voices can only lift us as a nation.
